Headwaters Basketmakers Guild

This year at Bemidji Catherine Peters taught 2 classes involving antlers. One was to be a table basket with the antlers as a base or stand and the other was to be a wall hanging with the antler at the top and the weaving descending. She showed us how to drill the holes and how to space them. We did use quick drying glue to set the reeds in the antler and the weaving was done by simple twining. All of them turned out a little differently from the design offered but each turned out as it's own unique basket. The wall hangings were done fairly straight forward as the design suggested. Catherine is a very patient teacher and was open to any suggestion from anyone to change anything we wanted.
