Jo has been an avid willow basket maker and teacher for more than 30 years. She has taught, shared her knowledge of willow and these techniques in her work throughout the United States and beyond. In recent years, Jo has hosted a number of basketry tours to Ireland, Scotland, Spain, Italy, France, Denmark, Wales and England, visiting with basketry weavers in those countries, learning new skills with willow and other natural materials. Join us as Jo takes us on a virtual European tour, meeting some of those basket makers and learn about basketry abroad!

Part 2: 1-3pm – Part 2 will be led by Debbie Johnson and Sarah Peterson. Join us as we explore one of our twin city regional parks (park TBD), to harvest wild willow or other weaving materials!
