

<u>Class:</u> Weaving on Lake Superior beach stones – Debbie Johnson; we will work on 3 variations. <u>Cost:</u> \$25.00 – *Guild membership must be active*. Membership can be renewed the day of class. **Class is Limited to the first 12 registrants!** See attached class registration form.

Not taking the class?? **Come join us for a lunch pot luck!!!** We would love to see folks in living color! Bring a dish to share. Join in some fun conversation and see what we are up too! We will break for lunch at 12:30 - 1:30. Coffee will be available, as will plates, cups, napkins & plastic utensils. Please bring your own beverage if coffee isn't your thing!

Do you like to weave with birch bark, or want to try playing with it? Our Guild received a donation of birch bark. It is pre-cut into strips approximately $\frac{34}{7}$ in width and various lengths. We also received -----sheets of bark, approximately ------in size. It is quite dry and will require re-hydration. We will be making it available for \$5 / 8 oz. bundle for strips and \$5 per sheet, (13"x18" to 18"x24") to those who have renewed their membership.

<u>October 23 – VIA Zoom – Coiling on a Gourd - Jane Wilson,</u> <u>Gourd Artist</u>

We are delighted to have nationally recognized gourd weaver Jane A. Wilson as our October instructor! Originally from Kansas, Jane began working with gourds in 2007. She found they offer the opportunity to

coil, twine, carve, and wood burn. She also makes use of paints, stains, and inks (often on the same piece) in the creation of her original gourd art. Coiling has become her favorite technique and she has developed a way of dyeing cord to match the colors she uses on her gourds. An award-winning gourd artist, Jane recently won Best of Advanced Division at the Missouri Show Me Gourd Art Festival. She placed third in a national gourd weaving competition sponsored by the American Gourd Society and her gourd art has been featured in the society's GOURD magazine.

finished 4 1/2" - 5" gourd (ready to weave), hand dyed

cord, beads, drill bit, needle, sharpie, waxed linen thread and color, step-by-step instructions with detailed photos. Students will need a drill, scissors, pencil and awl.

Color choices (indicate option on registration form):

1. Metallic finish with three colors (purple, turquoise and blue), the cord is also dyed in those variegated colors then they pick the color of thread

2. Natural finish with a coppery finish gourd with natural cord, copper beads and brown thread.

Welcome Gayle! Gayle joined us this past year and is now going to be our new Treasurer! Welcome Gayle and Thank you for jumping in to support the Guild. She kindly took some time to tell us a little bit about herself:

Tell us a little bit about yourself -

I am a single mom who adopted a baby who is Hmong twenty-seven years ago. She is now finishing nursing school! I grew up in Saint Croix Falls, lived in Ohio then Kentucky before moving to Saint Paul in 1988. I live in a 1920s bungalow and love vintage style and antiquing.

What interested you in joining the basketweavers guild?

Before my retirement from healthcare in December 2020, I decided I wanted to learn other crafts that I might be able to incorporate my beads with. Basketry seemed like a good choice- and I am hooked! Plus, I am all about the process versus the project and basketry is a wonderful process.

What is your favorite basket style?

I made my first basket- stitched Ojibway- in July 2018. Then I took a ten-week Birch class at the American Swedish Institute. My favorite is weaving the diagonal plaited pattern- for baskets and pouches- birch bark preferred.

What prompted you to take over the treasurer role this coming year?

I think that offering to be MBWG treasurer would be a manageable task for me to help this guild. And who doesn't love a spreadsheet? I have used spreadsheets to manage Girl Scout Cookie orders for several troops, the membership list & finances for a Chinese Adoption organization, the checking account for a soccer team, tracking client info & orders for my healthcare job, and even listings for my knitting needles, yarn, patterns and glass inventory!! This seemed like my skill set!

Anything else you would like us to know?

I have 3 dogs of my own, but I also foster dogs, usually older & needing medical attention. I am a life-long knitter, I have spent many years loom weaving and now have a lampwork studio in my basement to make glass beads. Since retirement I have taken many Nordic cooking & craft classes (Sami bracelets & embroidery), Rosemaling, needle felting, and natural dyeing of fiber & yarn- baskets are next!

Seems like you are well on your way with baskets! We welcome you Gayle, and your enthusiasm!
